WHAT WILL WE BE DOING?

Construction: Many homes in our area need a lot of work – and the people need a lot of love! In Construction, you get to love AND serve the homeowner! You may be roofing, painting, replacing flooring, or any number of tasks. Regardless, you'll have an opportunity to share Christ's love with the homeowner. In construction, long pants are sometimes required, so make sure you bring them!

Community: The Community teams serve by assisting local ministries and residents with their needs. This is one of our most practical and effective ministries where you'll be exposed to some wonderful people. You may be mowing lawns for widows, serving at a clothing or food pantry, or visiting a nursing home. You might help local organizations or schools with maintenance. Regardless, you share the love of Christ in very practical ways.

Children: We will offer a basic curriculum and framework and your volunteers will add their own talents to the curriculum we provide. The daycamps will begin at around 11:00 am each day, and we will provide a full lunch and about 4 hours of programming to the children each day. Drivers, be prepared to help us pick up some children who, because of transportation limitations, would not be able to attend! **f you have any specific talents or skills, tell us when you register online.**

HOW SHOULD WE DRESS?

We have a simple dress code to help us minister in this community with integrity and promote safety. Expect these to be enforced!

- ☐ Check the weather before you come: pack for the weather.
- □ Long Pants: may be required for some projects. Bring a pair or two for safety reasons (yard cleanup, construction)
- □ Closed FOOT shoes: (athletic shoes / boots) Shoes protect the feet flip flops and crocs don't.
- ☐ Don't bring new & fancy clothing or shoes they' may get dirty!
- ☐ Keep your clothing modest with no negative, offensive, or political messages
- □ No cutoffs / tank tops we ask everyone to simply wear normal t-shirts throughout the week.
- ☐ Swimwear make sure it's conservative and appropriate for this setting.

Extra Clothing

All participants should pack clothing for a variety of ministries. You should be prepared to work in construction, children, or community ministries. Laundry is not available.
